Advocacy	44	S	C + H	services with or on behalf of students, (including parents/family members, teachers, service agencies, and others) designed to ensure that migrant children and families receive the full range of services available to them; includes but is not limited to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • school-home linkage • regular education program linkage • health / dental / social service linkage • interstate linkage
Adolescent Leadership	41	I/S	C + H	Program(s) including CloseUp sponsored by statewide migrant program that helps secondary students develop leadership skills and assists them in setting goals for the future. ONLY to be recorded when Statewide Program directs METS to use it
Bilingual	2	I	C	services that involve both teaching of ENL as well as instruction and content area support in student's native language
Career Exploration	43	S	C + H	activities and events hosted or coordinated by local/statewide MEP that provides 14 to 21 year old students opportunities to visit career sites, tour colleges/universities, talk with role models, and to participate in confidence-building activities and discussions
Computer Literacy	18	I	C	services to develop skills in the operation and use of a computer
Counseling Services	30	S	C + H	services to help a student to better identify and enhance his or her educational, personal, or occupational potential; relate his or her abilities, emotions, and aptitudes to educational and career opportunities; utilize his or her abilities in formulating realistic plans; and achieve satisfying personal and social development. These activities take place between one or more counselors and one or more students as consultees, between students and students, and between counselors and other staff members. The services can also help the child address life problems or personal crisis that result from the culture of migrancy. (definition from Consolidated State Performance Report (CSPR) guidance).

Mathematics	13	I	C + H	services that develop skills in mathematics
Nutrition	26	S	C	Nutritional information and/or food provided to a student
P.A.S.S	15	I	C	Portable Assisted Study Sequence or semi-independent program to allow students to make up partial or full credits of coursework necessary for grade promotion or high school graduation requirements
Referred Services	23	S	C	student was referred to an educational or educationally related service funded by another non-MEP program/organization that they would not have otherwise received without efforts supported by MEP.
Referred and Received Service	4	S	C	Student was referred to and received an educational or educationally related service funded by another non-MEP program/organization that they would not have otherwise received without efforts supported by MEP.
School Readiness	6	I	C + H	Services that assist students with skills necessary to successfully enter Kindergarten
