Scissor Skills -Setting Up For Success

Scissors

Dull scissors will not cut paper

Paper


- Lightweight construction paper bends instead of cutting
- It is easier for small hands to hold and cut paper that is narrow

Practice, Practice, Practice

Scissor Skills -Straight and Curvy Lines

Instead of cutting around an object, your student can start by cutting on a line leading up to the object.

"Download" Button! This takes you to an ad. The website gives you a [print] option on the picture. If you Right-click on the picture, you can save it. (This is true for many websites, not just this one.)

Scissor Skills - Cutting Random Pieces to Fill a Design

Preparation:

- 1-inch strips of colored paper
- Draw picture outline on paper

Student:

- Cuts the 1-inch strips into random pieces;
- Then glues the pieces to "fill" the picture outline.

Combine Scissor Skill Practice with Other Activities

Shapes:

- Draw a circle, square, triangle or rectangle to fill with the cut pieces of paper.
- Use the cutting time to talk about the shape with the student.

Retelling the story:

- Draw a simple outline of something from the story (ex. a truck) to fill with the cut pieces of paper.
- Use the cutting time to talk about what happened in the story.

Use the same link as the "Straight & Curvy Lines" to find picture- outlines related to the seasons and holidays to get you started. Scroll down to "More Scissor Skills Practice Projects."

Story Paper Activities:


- Use to practice individual letters
- Use for student to retell the story: Draw a picture, dictate a sentence
- Use to write/trace/ copy the Student's Name or letter(s)


Emergent Writing – Alphabet Handwriting Worksheets and Books, English and Spanish

- Individual booklets to practice writing each letter and glue in picture words that start with the letter.

Emergent Writing -Letter Formation Charts

For traveling tutors, sometimes one chart with all 26 letters is more helpful than 26 different worksheets, to help you target the individual letters each student needs to write their name.


If you don't have one,


- You can ask the local elementary school for a chart, as schools use different styles.
- You can google, "free printable handwriting charts."

Handwriting Without Tears is a trademark curriculum for purchase. But its website has free "Letter Formation Charts" with suggested arrows and

Charts" with suggested arrows and words to think/say as forming the letters and numbers.



The lower-case letters are grouped by the similar ways they are formed.

Counting - Utilize the Real Need for Counting in your Other Activities

Retelling a story:

 "How many trucks are in this story? Let's count..."

Practicing shapes:

• "How many circles do you want to draw? (3 or 4?)"

Play with linking cubes – use stacks of 5 (or smaller). While the student plays, you can ask counting questions:


- "How many stacks do you want?
 (2 for you and 2 for your brother?
 Let's count...)"
- When it is time to pick up: "Here is one red, where are more reds? Are there 5? Let's count 1-2-3-4 uh oh, one is missing. Let's look for one more red block..." (with the bonus that you leave with all of the blocks)

- Five-Frame-Concentration (this is the only one with the game cards used by all 4 games)
- Five-Frame-Flash (need counters)
- Five-Frame-Match (need a die)
- Five-Frame-Numeral-Match (need counters)

Prepositions - Game Cards

Google: "free printable preposition worksheets for preschoolers." Open the generic site of printable images. This site pulls in samples from a different websites. Click on the one you want to use. It will go to another screen for printing. (2 samples are highlighted below)

Game: Pick a card and act it out while using the preposition in a sentence: "Juanita is **under** the chair."



Starting with the photos of the child might help your student connect the owl cartoon cards with the real actions.
